1. **Maths**

You should have taken a sheet home yesterday to practise calculating missing angles inside fractions. If you are finding this tricky, remember:

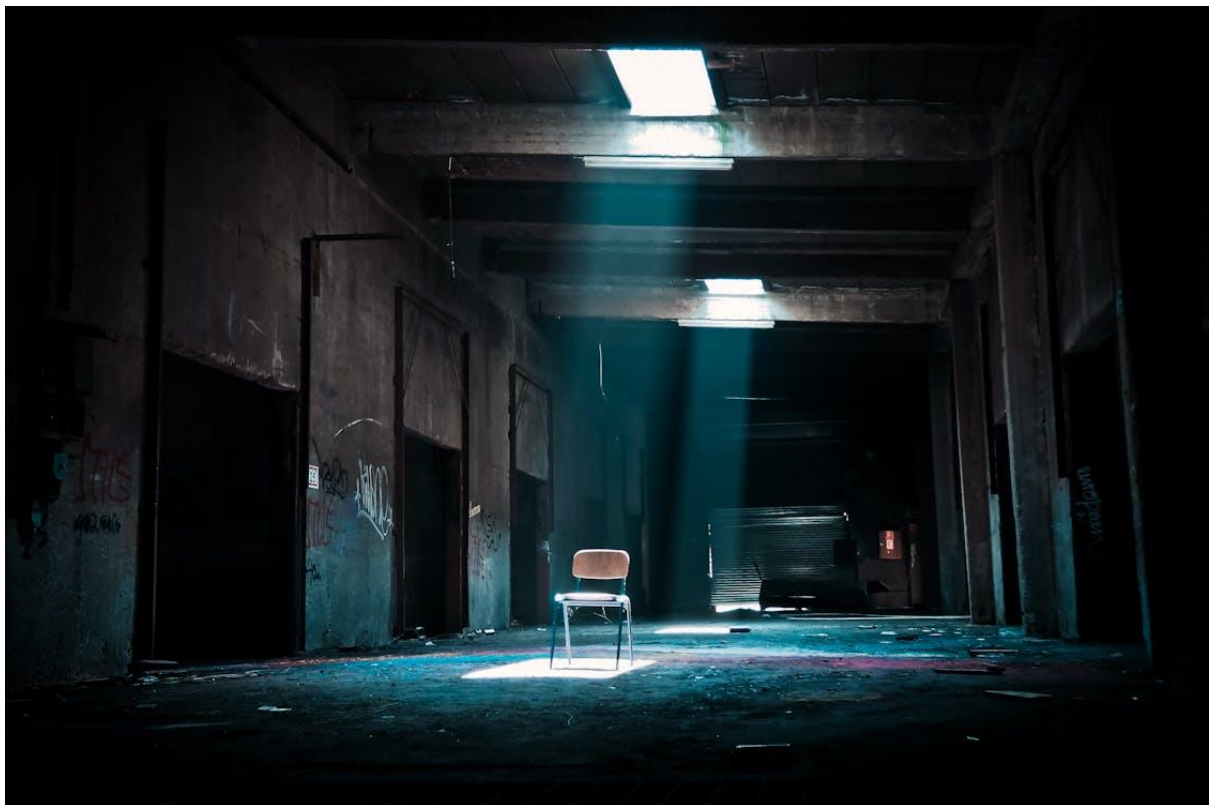
- All angles in a triangle add up to 180°
- Isosceles triangles have 2 equal sides and 2 equal angles
- Equilateral triangles have 3 equal sides and 3 equal angles

2. **English**

Use this picture to inspire you to write a flashback story. You have all been doing a fab job at creating atmosphere in your story so think about this whilst you are writing.

Use the success criteria we built together to support you in your writing.



Success Criteria:

- I can write in the past tense
- I can write in 1st person
- I can use speech to advance the action in a story

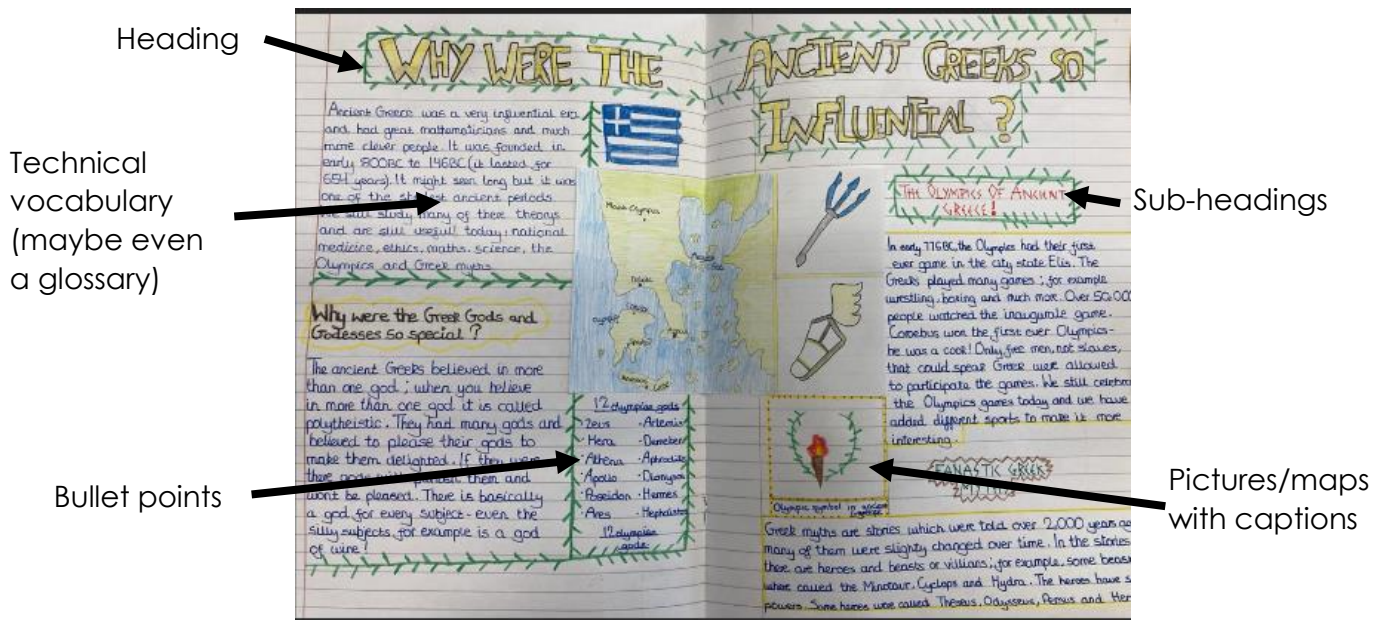
- I can select vocabulary to create atmosphere and keep my reader engaged (fronted adverbials, figurative language)
- I can use compound, complex and simple sentences to make my writing engaging
- I can join my handwriting
